Topics Covered in this Presentation

- An Eco Pass is an annual transit pass that allows for <u>free</u>, <u>unlimited</u> access to all Local, Express, and Regional bus and light rail routes across the RTD network in Boulder and the Denver metropolitan area.
- For example, the SKIP and Route #204 bus routes serve our Holiday neighborhood.
- A trip to DIA on the AB bus route, aka the SkyRide, is \$2.50 each way with your Holiday Eco Pass and includes free rides for children under the age of 16.

What is the Holiday Eco Pass Program?

- The Eco Pass program is one of the largest items on the Holiday Master HOA budget
- It currently costs about \$20,000 per year

How much does it cost the Holiday HOA?

The Holiday Eco Pass is paid for by your monthly Holiday Master HOA fee (currently ~\$20/month, per household)

How is it paid for?

- The Holiday Eco Pass program is for residents of the Holiday Neighborhood only - see map at http://www.holidayneighborhood.com/ map.php for the geographic boundaries of the Holiday Neighborhood
- There is no limit to the number of Eco Passes per household

Who can use it?

- # of Holiday households 343
- # of Holiday residents 631
- # of Holiday Smart Cards 535
- RTD has no usage data for the Smart Cards, yet!
